Bird Girls/Mayzie/Gertrude:

- All are in charge of getting their own Converse high-tops
- All birds should be in colorful dresses or skirt/top combinations to which we can add feathers, beads, fringe, boas, etc. to plus them out

Mayzie:

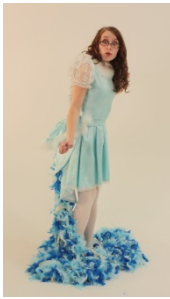
- Mayzie should be in the most extravagantly dressed; a dress that moves well and suits her coloring (anything really, as long as it's plussed out with flowing elements and feathers. She should have an extravagant tail.



Gertrude:

- Gertrude should be more modest and cute in her dress, with coloring opposite to Mayzie and a small boa tail. Later, she will need a ridiculously long prop tail that should be able to pin to her costume that should be three boas braided together and require her to hold it in heaps on her arms.

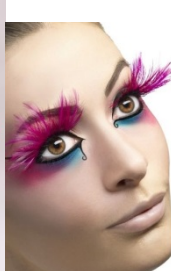
Secretary Bird:

...BUT Modernized & Feathered.

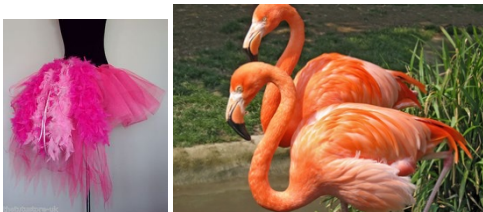
Bird Girls: To personalize them, we'll go with specific species and colors:

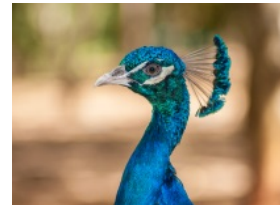

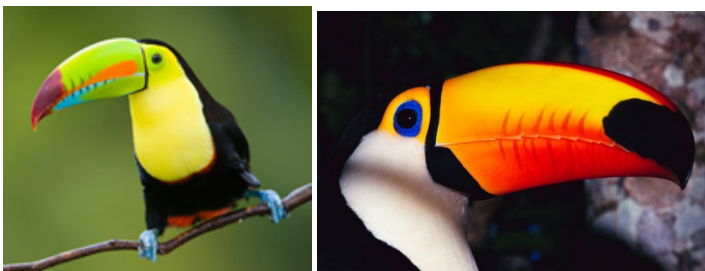

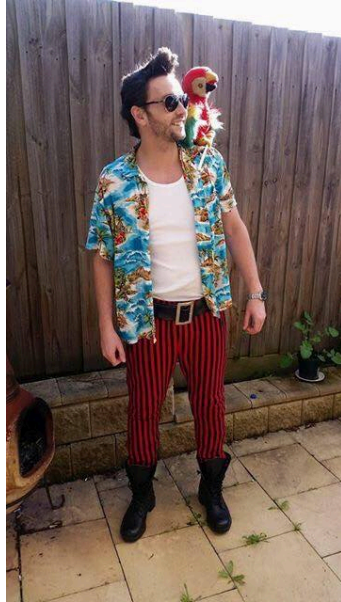


Christina Ross – Crowned Crane (spike and frost her hair!)
